What has the main character realised? What is going to happen next? How is the main character feeling?</p> <p>Will you start your story using action, dialogue, a setting description or a different way?</p> <p>How many of the year 6 expectations can you include? There is a list of these on our class page.</p>	<p>English – Everyday choose 5 spellings from either the year 3/4 or 5/6 spelling list, which is in the back of your planner or can be found on line, and practise these in different ways. Can you put them into a paragraph?</p>	<p>Science – In your garden or out of your window make a list of the different animals you can see. Draw a picture of each of these animals. Record their characteristics and state which group they belong to eg birds, insects etc.</p>	<p>Computing – On scratch locate the show and hide program blocks and add these to your animation or build a new one containing these. You can use these to change a backdrop to make your animation a story.</p>	
<p>RE – Do you think religion and science or complementary or conflicting? Write a paragraph to explain your feelings giving reasons based on what we have learnt about so far this term.</p>	<p>Maths – Try one of these problems everyday start from day 8. Remember to use the second page!</p>	<p>Science – Take a record of your heart rate before and after your daily Joe Wicks workout or other exercise. Put this information in a table. If possible, use this to construct a graph to present your information.
