Children's completed homework tasks will be recorded and monitored. Children who successfully engage in home learning tasks will be rewarded at school.</p> <p>Please ask parents, family members or friends to join in and have fun. When each task is completed you need to bring it in or take photographs. The photographs do not have to be printed and can be sent to your class teacher using Class Dojo. When evidence is seen we will tick off your tasks and record your choices. We are hoping by giving everyone choices that a selection of activities will be completed by pupils with support from family members.</p>				
<p>Maths</p> <p>Research the currency that was used in Britain at the time of World War II and then use the currency to create your own weekly shopping list showing the total amount spent.</p>	<p>English</p> <p>Can you read a story set in World War II and discuss it with a friend or family member?</p>	<p>Science</p> <p>Grow your own plant at home and record its progress, measure its height and photograph it on a regular basis.</p>	<p>Art</p> <p>Make a drawing, painting or collage of a Second World War scene.</p> <p>You may also like to create a model gas mask for the box you are creating as part of your maths homework task.</p>	
<p>RE</p> <p>Describe how you celebrate Christmas Day in your household.</p>	<p>History</p> <p>Research a famous wartime leader and write a biography about their life and the impact they had on the war.</p>	<p>History</p> <p>Look at rationing and create a menu from the food items that were available in England at the time.</p>	<p>Music</p> <p>Listen to the following videos on YouTube. Can you identify any instruments that are being played and describe the sounds you hear, consider the changes in the speed the music is being played at – what could this be representing. Then draw an image to show how the music is making you feel.</p> <p>WW2 War is coming and Two steps from hell.</p>	
<p>English</p> <p>Create your own game that would keep you entertained in your air raid shelter. Explain how your game is played and the rules involved.</p>	<p>PSHE</p> <p>As a family, discuss where money is spent on a regular basis and in a list show your weekly outgoings.</p>	<p>Maths</p> <p>Design a gas mask box; you will need to measure and create your own net for a cube or cuboid.</p>	<p>Cooking</p> <p>Research World War 2 recipes and perhaps have a go at making one to enjoy with your family. Could you photograph you family meal to show us at school?</p>	
<p>Reading – Children should be encouraged to read every day. Please spend 5 or 10 minutes listening to your child read and discussing their books.</p>			<p>Maths – All children from Year 1 to Year 6 have all been provided with a log in for Times Table Rockstars or Numbots. Children should be completing at least 3x5 minutes each week.</p>
