This week in maths, we are learning about multiples of different numbers.

What do you notice about the multiples of 5?

 7,135 is a multiple of 5. Explain how you know.

 Roll 2 dice (1-6), and multiply the numbers the you roll. List all the numbers that this number is a multiple of. Repeat the dice roll. Use a table to show your results. Multiply the numbers you roll to complete the table.



As this involves your times tables, continue to practice these using TT Rockstars and see if you can turn some of the multiplication facts into division facts e.g. $6 \times 8 = 48$ so $48 \div 8 = 6$

Science

As part of our science topic this term, can you research some of the planets in our solar system and create a factual leaflet showing what you have learnt.

History

Our topic this term is Vikings, we will begin by looking at where they came from and where they invaded/settled. Research where these places are and can you find them on a map.
