When each task is completed you need to bring it in or take photographs. The photographs do not have to be printed and can be sent to your class teacher using Class DoJo. When evidence is seen we will tick off your tasks and record your choices. We are hoping by giving everyone choices that a selection of activities will be completed by pupils with support from family members.				
Maths – Year 1: Practice reading and writing numbers of words from 1-20. Making sure to spell the numbers in words accurately. Year 2: Practice reading and writing numbers of words from 1-100. Making sure to spell the numbers in words accurately. Practice counting in 2's, 5's and 10's. Year 2 to do this from any given number, practicing counting forwards and backwards.	English – Practice Year 1 and Year 2 common exception word list. Practice these with different spelling strategies that are on your class website pages. Practice handwriting by copying out and focussing on your letter formation of your favourite songs/ poems/ short stories.	History – Sir Josph Banks loved discovering plants! Go outside and find different leaves or flowers. Draw and label them in a "Discovery Diary". Or Create an Explorer's Fact File. Research Sir Josph Banks and create a fact file including; when and where he was born, what he is famous for, his role on Captain Cook's Voyage and Why he is important today.	RE – Easter Art Project Design an Easter Egg that represents the story of Easter. Can you use a various art materials to create your eggs and explain your designs? Maths - All children from Year 1 to Year 6 have all been provided with a log in for Times Table Rockstars or Numbots. Children should be completing at least <u>3x5 minutes each week.</u>	
Science – Animals , including Humans. - Create an Animal Life cycle poster; choose an animal and draw its life cycle in four stages and label each stage. - Create a healthy eating plate- draw out pictures of foods and sort them into different food groups. (fruit and vegetable, proteins, dairy, carbohydrates and fats)	PSHE – Relationships My special people: Create a poster about the special people in their lives. Draw pictures or use photos and write a few sentences about why each person is special to them.	The Arts – DT Get involved with helping cooking a meal with an adult, practice chopping, spreading, mixing skills and share your pictures on Dojo with your teacher. We can't wait to see what you end up doing! Why not create a food safety hygiene poster too?!	English - Reading Children should be encouraged to read every day. Please spend 5 or 10 minutes listening to your child read and discussing their books.
