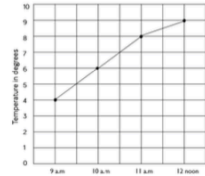

Class 4 grew a plant. They measured the height of the plant every week for 6 weeks. The table shows the height of the plant each week.

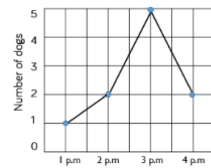
