Write a descriptive paragraph about the Queen.

Simple sentence : A sentence containing a subject and a verb. For example: A book fell on my foot.

Compound sentence: A sentence which contains two simple sentences joined with a connective. For example: A book fell on my foot and it made me scream.

Complex: a sentence containing a subordinate clause (a part of a sentence that does not make sense on its own). For example: In the library, a book fell on my foot.
