Monday	Share the story. Monkey Puzzle by Julia Donaldson. Mrs Chiumento is uploading this story to tapestry or you can listen to the story in song via this link....	Shape, Space and Measure Create a picture of a monkey. What shapes have you used?	Play a phonics game – phonicsplay.com are allowing free membership.	Sing Song – walking through the jungle. Can you make the animal noises and create your own actions.  Understanding of the World/People and communities: Using your shared story as a prompt, compare similarities and differences between these where we live and where the baby monkey lives.  Physical development – fine motor. Use small objects like cheerios or pieces of macaroni to spell out the names of jungle animals. If you feel up for a challenge can you arrange them into an animal picture?
Tuesday	Reading. Oxford Owl website book or home reading book	Shape, Space and Measure Can you cut out snakes of all different sizes then order them from the smallest to the largest.	Choose a phoneme and try to think of as many words as you can that contain that phoneme. Such as. 's' or 'ch'	Art and Design/Imagination: Monkeys like to eat fruit. Draw a picture of your favourite fruit. Look closely at the fruit and try to get as much detail on the picture as possible. What colours could you use? What shapes?  Social and Emotional: Play a turn taking game. This could be I Spy, Pairs, Hide and Seek.
Wednesday	Writing activity. Use the picture of our new pygmy goats on our class page. Can you think of names for our goats and write a sentence about them.	Number Roll a dice and say the number that is one more and less. If you feel like a challenge write numbers to 20 on pieces of paper and take it in turns to flip one over and say the number that is one more and one less.	Make a letter collage. Use an old magazine or toy catalogue and ask you children to cut out pictures that begin with different sounds.	Art and design/ Imagination: Since we have been on lockdown the world has had a little break and lots of animals are having nicer cleaner homes. Can you create something for the animals. Perhaps you could make an animal house for the garden, or a bird feeder to hang. Ideas are on our class webpage.  Technology: With a grown-ups help can you research our pygmy goats.
