The pirates are coming to Coningsby!

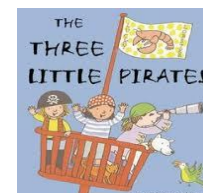


This term we will be using pirates as the starting point for our learning and exploring treasure chests, reading and creating maps and learning about life on board a pirate ship.

We will be exploring life under the sea with Rainbow Fish and the treasure which is our natural world in RE and with the text Snail and the Whale.

As Coningsby scientists we are... excited to explore under the sea habitats and creatures. We are going to create some small world play in the water areas.

As Coningsby readers and writers we will... be reading and then writing in response to the book '3 Little Pirates' by Georgie Adams and Emily Bolam.



This simple chapter book explores the adventures of a group of girl pirates including treasure hunts, sea monsters and mermaids!

We will continue with our daily phonics and formation lessons to develop our basic reading and writing skills. We are aiming for all the children to be writing their names by the end of term.

As Coningsby believers we will... be exploring the church school value of truthfulness.

We will be looking at the eastern European Folk Tale 'Stone Soup' to support our learning around being truthful and a kind citizen.

We will continue to explore our wonderful world and creation stories from Christianity, Judaism and Hinduism this term.
