At Coningsby St Michael's, we believe all areas of the curriculum are important. This term we would like you to choose a minimum of 4 activities from the grid below, as your homework tasks. Other than reading and times table practise, no weekly homework will be set. We hope that this style of homework will encourage everyone to take part and give parents a chance to become more involved in working with their children on fun, creative and exciting activities. Children's completed homework tasks will be recorded and monitored. Children who successfully engage in home learning tasks will be rewarded at school.

Please ask parents, family members or friends to join in and have fun. When each task is completed you need to bring it in or take photographs. The photographs do not have to be printed and can be sent to your class teacher using Class DoJo. When evidence is seen we will tick off your tasks and record your choices. We are hoping by giving everyone choices that a selection of activities will be completed by pupils with support from family members. Teachers will speak to parents if children are not engaging in home learning activities.

Maths – Choose 5 Central American countries and put them in order by their population size or land mass. Then round these to the same degree of accuracy.

e.g. nearest ten, hundred, thousand, etc.

English – Write a first-person narrative about a sighting of a rare animal.

Science – Plan a balanced evening meal for your family from Monday to Friday.

Art – Design and represent your own Maya God. You could draw, paint, make a 3d model etc.

RE – On the internet search for evidence in churches that show what Christians think and believe about their God.

History – Research Mayan legends and then write your own legend connected to the Mayan Civilisation.

Science – Do a range of exercises of your choice. Record your pulse rate before and after exercise. Show your results using your own methods eg table, graph.

PE – Write an exercise diary for the week. Count up the number of hours and minutes that you exercised in that week

What did you notice?

English – Write a book review about a book that you have read at home this term and would recommend for someone else.

PSHE – Make a comic strip story showing one of our three school rules...

Maths – For a week choose 5 different countries and record daily low and high temperatures. What is the difference between the temperatures?

Cooking – Using your meal plan can you prepare or help to prepare at least one of the meals.

Reading – Children should be encouraged to read every day. Please spend 5 or 10 minutes listening to your child read and discussing their books. Please encourage your child to fill in their reading record.

Maths – All children from Year 1 to Year 6 have all been provided with a log in for Times Table Rockstars or Numbots. Children should be completing at least 3x5 minutes each week.
