As Coningsby believers we will:

In R.E. are continuing to explore the relationship between science and religion when looking at the Christian story of creation and the scientific view-point.

As Coningsby Authors we will:

Be writing a first-person narrative.
An information text about wolves.
A suspense narrative

As Coningsby Artists & Designers we will:

Be exploring different collage techniques.
We will use the Notan technique to create a mirror image considering the contrast between the negative and positive space.
We will learn about the artist Lance Letscher and the style of art he favours.



As Coningsby Scientists we will:

Be finding out about classification of plants and animals.
We will be exploring how living things are classified
We will be investigating the divisions and sub-divisions living things are grouped into.

As Coningsby Geographers we will be exploring:

We will be finding out about deserts of the world. We will find out about plants, animals and people who live in deserts and how they survive these extreme conditions.
