As Coningsby Forest Schoolers we will:


Be observing the season and the changes it as made. We will start to investigate where mini-beasts live within the mystical garden and build shelters for them. We will work as a group to make a wooden welly boot stand, using different tools to construct within the mystical garden. We will be using clay and leaf printing to make coasters, looking at the different patterns they create.

As Coningsby Authors we will:

Be focussing our learning on Rhythm of the Rain, the children will use this text to help support them to write a setting narrative and then an information on the wonders of the world . We will be using prepositions and continuing to use a range of conjunctions in our writing as well as being able to confidently use apostrophes where letters are missing.

As Coningsby Scientists we will:

We will be exploring animals including humans. We will begin by recapping what we know of the topic, then we will be researching nutrients and identifying different food groups, identifying food groups in our favourite meal, investigating food packaging, investigating why animals including humans need the right types of nutrients, how nutrients, water and oxygen are transported within humans and animals. Our key skills will be identifying, classifying and grouping, research using secondary resources and comparative and fair testing.



As Coningsby believers we will:

Be learning about the trinity and the Christian belief that God has three ways of being. We will learn about baptism and why it is important.

As Coningsby Historians we will:

Explore Stone Age to Iron Age Britain. We will look at how history is split into ages by historians and learn why. We will learn that the period of non-human history is much longer than human history. We will find out about the importance Neolithic Revolution. We will discover the main achievements of each age exploring tool making, farming, settlements and beliefs and society, know the limitations of our evidence for learning about life in pre-history.

As Coningsby Artists we will:

Explore cave paintings and create our own cave painting, we will look at discussing the outlines and how we can use our sketching skills to create different shapes, we will then look at colour mixing to create a silhouette picture of Stone Henge.

As Coningsby Mathematicians we will:

Continue to develop our understanding of multiplication and division and continue to learn and practice our times tables. As well as 2, 3 and 10 x times table we will focus on our 3, 4 and 8 x times table. Please support these at home. We will look at working with money then begin to work with statistics towards the end of the term.
