Children's completed homework tasks will be recorded and monitored. Children who successfully engage in home learning tasks will be rewarded at school. Please ask parents, family members or friends to join in and have fun. You can use your homework task book for writing tasks, evidence logs, saving photos or collecting any other evidence of your learning. When each task is complete you need to bring it in or take photographs. The photographs do not have to be printed and can be sent to your class teacher using Class DoJo. When evidence is seen we will tick off your tasks and record your choices. We are hoping by giving everyone choices that a selection of activities will be completed by pupils with support from family members. Teachers will speak to parents if children are not engaging in home learning activities.</p>				
<p><b>Maths</b> Can you create some fractions questions that involve found objects around the home. Eg. I have twenty cars, 5 of the them are blue. What fraction are blue?</p>	<p><b>English</b> Our text for the term Jemmy Button is all about a boy who goes on a journey around the world. Retell the story of a dream that takes you to different places around the world.</p>	<p><b>Science</b> Make a moving skeleton using the Twinkl resource we have attached on the website. If you need split pins ask your class teacher.</p>	<p><b>Outdoor Focus</b> Go on a walk with family and look out for signs of spring- what stage can you see the different plants in, can you describe the different parts of the plants to your family or friends?</p>	
<p><b>Maths</b> Cook a favourite recipe and do all the measuring! This will give you real life examples of mass and capacity and extra practice in reading scales. Don't forget to share the photos on dojo!</p>	<p><b>English</b> Read a book by the same author or about a journey. ( see list of examples) Can you write a book review for your friends?</p>	<p><b>RE</b> Christian's learn about God from the teachings in the bible. Christmas and Easter are examples of special events for Christians. What special events do you celebrate? Why are these special to you? What would it mean if you couldn't celebrate them anymore?</p>	<p><b>Art</b> Look at the work of the artist Henri Rousseau. Can you create your own jungle artwork?</p> 	
<p><b>Geography</b> Write a factfile about an animal or plant that lives in a tropical rainforest.</p>	<p><b>Geography</b> Research different countries around the world finding out the name of their capital city, which continent they are in, and what their flag looks like.</p>	<p><b>PSHE</b> Thinking about our school value this term Thankfulness- can you write a list of the different ways that you are thankful for your family and friends.</p>
