As Coningsby Authors we will...

be responding to our text for this term "The Promise". We will be writing a character narrative and a Newspaper Report using the theme of this story.

As Coningsby Geographers we will...

learn about the effects of tides and waves and how erosion helps shape our coastlines. We will be learning about Australia as a country and as part of this we will be comparing the coastlines of the UK and Australia with a particular focus on the Great Barrier Reef.

Year 5 Term 6 Curriculum

As Coningsby Scientists we will...

Continue to explore different forces – focusing on air resistance, water resistance, levers, gears and pulleys and the effects these can have.



As Coningsby Mathematicians we will...

Continue our work about decimals, explore negative numbers including finding the difference between two negative numbers, converting various units of measures and measuring volume.

As Coningsby believers we will...

read and discuss the Bible story of 'Jacob and Esau' – Genesis 25:27-34 and Genesis 27 & 28

We will continue to learn about expressing religious beliefs focussing particularly on how architecture reflects the beliefs of that religion. We will also end the year reflecting on 'Who is God to you?' and 'Is prayer useful?'

As Coningsby Artists & Designers we will...

be researching the work of an artist (Ken Done) and use his work to replicate a style. We will also explore aboriginal art and artists.

As part of our music work we will...

Learn how didgeridoos are created and played and we will also listen to traditional Australian aboriginal music to identify the different instruments used.
