<p>Maths</p> <p>Using items that you have at home e.g. lego bricks, pieces of pasta, a collection of items from your garden or from a walk show different fractions – e.g. Choose 50 lego bricks – what fraction is red, what fraction is blue, what fraction is yellow, etc</p>	<p>English</p> <p>Write a fact file about Arthur Conan Doyle – include things like where and when he was born, where he went to school, what jobs he had, his family and why he began writing stories.</p>	<p>Science</p> <p>Leave a saucer of water on a windowsill for a few days – observe what happens and explain why you think this has happened.</p>	<p>Geography/English</p> <p>Create a presentation – this could be a powerpoint or in written form about a fairtrade product.</p> <p>Show what the product is, where it comes from, which countries import this product and how it is transported.</p> <p>When it is completed, share your presentation with the class.</p>
