Dear Families,

Welcome back! I hope you all had a restful and enjoyable half-term break. As we begin this new term, I would like to share some important updates and upcoming events happening in school.

This term, our Collective Worship will focus on our six Christian values: Friendship, Honesty, Forgiveness, Respect, Thankfulness, and Responsibility. We will also continue learning about other faiths and British Values as we support children to become kind, respectful citizens. With Easter approaching, the children will also be exploring the Easter story during our worship sessions.

Respect continues to be one of our key school rules, alongside *Be Ready* and *Be Safe* and we will uphold high expectations for behaviour across the school. Thank you for your continued support; if any concerns arise, we will follow our Behaviour Policy and the Home-School- Agreement. Please contact us if you have any questions.

We are pleased to invite you to our Easter Service on Wednesday 1st April at 2:00pm at St Michael's Church in Coningsby. These services are always special occasions, and the children thoroughly enjoy taking part. We hope you can join us.

We will be celebrating World Book Day on Thursday 6th March. This is a wonderful opportunity to promote a love of reading, and we encourage you to read regularly with your child to support their skills, confidence, and enjoyment. More information will follow soon.

Our whole-school attendance is currently 93.8%, which is slightly below the national average. Improving attendance remains a key priority, as regular attendance is essential for ensuring every child achieves their full potential. Current national health guidance highlights that children should attend school as long as they are well enough and do not have symptoms that require them to stay at home. The NHS provides clear advice on when you should keep your child off school—for example:

- High temperature: Children should stay at home until the temperature has gone.
- Vomiting or diarrhoea: Keep children off for 48 hours after the last episode.
- Chickenpox: Children must stay home until all spots have crusted over (usually about 5 days).

Individual attendance for Term 3 will be reviewed shortly, and where attendance is a concern, support will be offered. Mrs Eden will contact families by phone or letter if needed. If your child is absent, please inform us as soon as possible. If we have not heard from you by 10:30am, we must follow our safeguarding procedures, which may include a home visit.

In line with DfE expectations, we are generally unable to authorise term-time holidays, and unauthorised absences may result in a Fixed Penalty Notice.

We have several exciting enrichment opportunities this term. On 1st April 2026 a group of Year 5 and 6 pupils will take part in the Swimathon at Jubilee Park in Woodhall, a fantastic community event organised by Rotary. It provides a great opportunity for children to raise funds for school initiatives, Following previous successes such as playground equipment and our new library, we look forward to seeing what they choose to support this year. Later this term, Year 5 and 6 will visit Lincoln Castle for a curriculum enrichment experience that will deepen and extend their learning. In March, a group of pupils will participate in an inter-school dodgeball competition at Barnes. We are grateful to JBSports and Barnes Wallis for continuing to provide sporting opportunities that help our pupils develop their skills and sportsmanship.

Parents' Evenings will take place on Tuesday 31st March and Wednesday 1st April. These meetings provide a valuable opportunity to discuss your child's progress and celebrate their work. Our Pastoral Team will also be available should you wish to discuss any support or concerns. Further details on how to book appointments will be shared soon.
