Other than reading and times table practise, no weekly homework will be set. We hope that this style of homework will encourage everyone to take part and give parents a chance to become more involved in working with their children on fun, creative and exciting activities. Children's completed homework tasks will be recorded and monitored. Children who successfully engage in home learning tasks will be rewarded at school.

Please ask parents, family members or friends to join in and have fun. You can use your homework task book for writing tasks, evidence logs, saving photos or collecting any other evidence of your learning. When each task is completed you need to bring it in or take photographs. The photographs do not have to be printed and can be sent to your class teacher using Class DoJo. When evidence is seen we will tick off your tasks and record your choices. We are hoping by giving everyone choices that a selection of activities will be completed by pupils with support from family members. Teachers will speak to parents if children are not engaging in home learning activities.

Maths

Using 10p pieces and 1p pieces can you make the following number:

24 32 50 11 39 49 28 43

Remember 10p is ten ones.

English

What is your favourite animal? Do some research about your favourite animal and create a fact file that gives information and interesting facts about your animal. Bring it to school to share with your class.

Science

What different animals can you see and find at home? These could be pets or creatures in the wild, birds, worms, bugs etc.

Make a chart to show what you can see each day for a week.

Art

Using any art materials you have for example: paint, collage materials, pencils, pens etc

Can you create an animal of your choice.

Cooking

Choose a country from around the world. Research a dish from that country and have a go at cooking it.

RE

What do you think God is like? Draw a picture and then write down what you think God is like.

Geography

Look at an atlas, map or globe. Where is the UK. Can you spot any other countries you know. Are they close to the North Pole, South Pole or the equator? What do you think it would be like there?

Healthy Eating

Using different fruits and vegetables can you design and make an animals face?

English

Write a poem about animals.

It could rhyme or it could be an acrostic poem.

PSHE

Create a picture with all of the important people from your life in it. Why are they important share your ideas with your grown ups.

Maths

What is your favourite pet? Draw a picture of it. Ask your family members at home and those that live further away. Can you make a graph/chart/pictogram that shows which pet is the most popular.

DT

Using junk boxes can you create an animal with one moving part. Like an elephant and its trunk moves.

Reading – Children should be encouraged to read every day. Please spend 5 or 10 minutes listening to your child read and discussing their books.

Maths – All children from Year 1 to Year 6 have all been provided with a log in for Times Table Rockstars or Numbots. Children should be completing at least 3x5 minutes each week.
