At Coningsby St Michael's we believe all areas of the curriculum are important. This term we would like you to choose a minimum of 4 activities from the grid below, as your homework tasks. Other than reading and times table practise, no weekly homework will be set. We hope that this style of homework will encourage everyone to take part and give parents a chance to become more involved in working with their children on fun, creative and exciting activities. Children's completed homework tasks will be recorded and monitored. Children who successfully engage in home learning tasks will be rewarded at school. Please ask parents, family members or friends to join in and have fun. When each task is completed, you need to bring it in or take photographs. When evidence is seen we will tick off your tasks and record your choices. We are hoping by giving everyone choices that a selection of activities will be completed by pupils with support from family members. Teachers will speak to parents if children are not engaging in home learning activities.				
Maths – Create your own clock face. Include the numbers, hour hand and minute hand. Show and label four different times, including a half past and a quarter past time.	English – Find out three interesting facts about wolves. You could draw a wolf and label it, write captions, or create a mini-information leaflet. Can you compare a wolf with a pet dog?	Science – Choose four everyday objects and describe their materials. Are they hard, soft, rough, smooth, flexible or waterproof? Explain how these properties help the object do its job.	Art – Create a picture of a busy place, such as a street, park or playground. Think about how L.S. Lowry painted people, buildings and everyday life. Include lots of interesting details and see if you can add some of Lowry's famous matchstick figures	
RE – Create a mind map titled 'Who is God to Christians?' Include words, pictures and symbols to show what Christians believe about God. Think about qualities such as love, forgiveness, power, kindness and being the Creator.	Geography – Create a poster showing the 7 continents and 5 oceans. Label each one correctly and add a picture, drawing or fact about your favourite continent.	Science – Find five objects around your home. Sort them by the material they are made from (wood, plastic, metal, glass or fabric) and explain why each material is suitable.	Geography – Choose three countries from different continents. Find and record each country's capital city, then create a fact file including the flag and one interesting fact about each place.	
English – Write your own short story about a character who bravely defeats a monster. Include a beginning, middle and ending.	PSHE – Talk with your family about something you are really good at. Draw a picture or write a sentence to show your strength and explain why it makes you feel proud.	Maths – Investigate time in your daily routine. Create a timetable showing five activities and the time they happen. Include at least one o'clock, half past, quarter past or quarter to time.	Cooking - Help an adult prepare a meal or bake something tasty. Talk about what happens first, next and last. Which parts took the longest? Share your favourite part of the cooking experience!	
Reading – Children should be encouraged to read every day. Please spend 5- or 10-minutes listening to your child read and discussing their books. You can now record when your child has read on Learning with Parents adding comments and videos.		Maths – All children from Year 1 to Year 6 have all been provided with a log in for Times Table Rockstars or Numbots (at least 3x5 minutes each week).
