


	Class 5G /5BGK	Learning question for the term Where does chocolate come from?	Science focus for the term Materials	RE focus for the term Christianity – The Last Days of Jesus’ Life.
<p>At Coningsby St Michael’s, we believe all areas of the curriculum are important. This term we would like you to choose a minimum of 4 activities from the grid below, as your homework tasks. Other than reading and times table practise, no weekly homework will be set. We hope that this style of homework will encourage everyone to take part and give parents a chance to become more involved in working with their children on fun, creative and exciting activities. Children’s completed homework tasks will be recorded and monitored.</p> <p>Please ask parents, family members or friends to join in and have fun. When each task is completed you could take photographs and send these to your class teacher via Class Dojo or bring it in to share with your teacher/class. We are hoping by giving everyone choices that a selection of activities will be completed by pupils with support from family members.</p>				
Maths Using items that you have at home e.g. lego bricks, pieces of pasta, a collection of items from your garden or from a walk show different fractions – e.g. Choose 50 lego bricks – what fraction is red, what fraction is blue, what fraction is yellow, etc OR Using a chocolate bar, pizza or cake, show different fractions – can you show half, a quarter, a fifth, tenth, etc.	English Write a fact file about Roald Dahl – include things like where and when he was born, where he went to school, what jobs he had, his family and why he began writing stories for children. The Roald Dahl website might help you to find facts to include.	Science Describe the process of how chocolate is made from cocoa bean to bar – use illustrations and sentences in your explanation.	Geography/English Create a presentation – this could be a powerpoint or in written form about a fairtrade product. Show what the product is, where it comes from, which counties import this product and how it is transported. When it is completed, share your presentation with the class.	
RE  Using Leonardo Da Vinci’s painting of ‘The Last Supper’ through this link	Geography Visit the supermarket (or on your weekly shop) look out for foods that show the ‘Fairtrade’ logo – make a list of these foods and create a poster that persuades people to buy these products.	Science Explore how water changes from solid to liquid to gas using the link below – try making each form of water yourself - then show your findings using diagrams and a written explanation. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=xYU7RSo0Z0U	PE After you have started your dance sessions with Mrs Phillips, create your own street dance routine (select your own piece of music/song) and then video yourself or your family performing your routine or if you prefer teach it to the rest of the class!.
