Use the information in the boxes below to draw a picture of what you think a Spartan and an Athenian looks like. After this investigate Athens and Sparta – how were these two city-states similar and different?

Athens

- Athens had the largest navy (number of warships) out of any of the Greek city-states.
- In Athens boys went to school but girls were taught at home.
- It was known for the amount of learning that happened there and Athenians were seen as the most intelligent people in Greece.
- There were theatre shows in Athens and writers would hold contests to see who wrote the best plays.

Sparta

- The Spartans didn't study philosophy, art, or theatre, they studied war.
- All Spartan men trained to become warriors from the day they were born.
- Sparta had no navy (very few warships)
- Boys were encouraged to steal food. If they were caught, they were punished, not for stealing, but for getting caught.
