
The Iron Man

Below are some activities so that children can continue their learning during the school closure.


Maths
Go outside and face in one direction. What are you looking at? Write it down. Now make a quarter turn clockwise. What are you looking at now? Write it down. Go back to your start position. Now follow these instructions and write down what you are facing each time:

- Half turn anticlockwise
- Three quarter turn anticlockwise
- Three quarter turn clockwise.

Maths
The arrow on a spinner started in this position.



After making a turn it ended in this position.



Jack says, The arrow has moved a quarter turn anti-clockwise.

Alex says, The arrow has moved a three-quarter turn clockwise.

Who do you agree with?

English

Once you have read or listened to Chapter 1 draw a picture of the Iron Man and label different parts of him using the words from the text.

English
Ted Hughes uses similes to describe the Iron Man.

A **simile** is a way of describing something by comparing it to something else using 'like' or 'as', usually in an interesting or imaginative way. Some examples are: 'as bright as a button'; 'as blind as a bat' or 'as quiet as a mouse'.

Your task is to choose 5 parts of the Iron Man's body and write your own simile for each one and write them down.

Using what you have at home try and make a 3D Iron Man. You can use cardboard boxes, bottle lids, tin foil etc. It can be as big or small as you want.
