Below are some activities so that children can continue their learning during the school closure. Mrs Appleyard and Miss Plaskitt will still be accessing Dojo during school hours Monday – Friday from 9:00am – 11:00am and would love to see pictures of activities the children complete!			
Maths: Can you practice multiplying larger numbers? Remember to use the methods we have looked at in school. Here are some examples: $54 \times 8 =$ $46 \times 4 =$ Pick a 2-digit number and then roll a dice to find a number to times by.	English: Practice your joined-up handwriting. You can choose what you would like to write about but we want to see it written in your most impressive handwriting!	Science: Plant some seeds. Make sure you water them every day. Can you make a growing journal? Draw a picture each day and write what you observe.	Art: Visit the 'Art for Kids Hub' YouTube channel. It is full of fantastic step by step instructions on how to draw brilliant pictures. Choose a few and have a go!
Maths: Use a ruler or a tape measure to measure the length of different objects from around your house. Can you use cm and mm?	English: Our class book this term is called 'Dinosaur trouble' Can you design a front cover for the book and write a blurb to tell me what you think might happen just from the title? Can you tell someone in your house some facts about rocks from the video?	PE: Take part in one session of Kids Cosmic Yoga each day. You can find this on YouTube.
Maths: Find something you can use to share (counters/raisins/grapes) Practise dividing by sharing and dividing by grouping. Watch this video to help: https://youtu.be/bdglIPNNhul	English: Everyday choose 5 spellings from the Y3/4 spelling list. Practice them in different ways. Can you put some of them into sentences?	PSHE: Draw a picture of the people in your family and write some sentences to describe why they are important. What do they do to help you?	History: Go on BBC Bitesize and play the game 'Dinosaur Discovery' to find some facts about dinosaurs and have ago at answering the questions.
Reading – Children should be encouraged to read every day. Please spend 5 or 10 minutes listening to your child read and discussing their books. Mrs Appleyard and Miss Plaskitt would love to know about what books you have been reading!		Maths – All children from Year 1 to Year 6 have all been provided with a log in for Times Table Rockstars or Numbots. Children should be completing at least 3x5 minutes each week.
