

	<b>Year 3</b>	<b>Learning question for the term:</b>  <b>Can I still find a dinosaur?</b>	<b>Science focus for the term:</b>  <b>Rocks and fossils</b>	<b>RE focus for the term:</b>  <b>Forgiveness</b>
Below are some activities so that children can continue their learning during the school closure. Mrs Appleyard and Miss Plaskitt will still be accessing Dojo during school hours Monday – Friday from 9:00am – 11:00am and would love to see pictures of activities the children complete!				
<b>Maths</b>  <b>Play Kaboom!</b> Write out some times table facts (3x8, 9x4) on some pieces of paper and make sure a few of the pieces say KABOOM! Place all of the cards face down and take turns to choose. If you answer the question correctly, you can keep it. If you get Kaboom, you have to put all of your cards back!	<b>English:</b>  Write an alternative blurb for you favourite book.  See if someone in your house can guess what book it is about.	<b>Science:</b>  Design and set up an evaporation experiment.  Fill a cup with water and put it near a window where it will be in the sun.  Observe what happens.	<b>Art:</b>  Sketch your own picture of a dinosaur. You can find a picture on the internet to help you.  Think carefully about the sketching skills that we have focussed on at in school.	
<b>Maths:</b>  Complete a shape hunt in your house. What 2D and 3D shapes can you find? What shape in the most common?	<b>English:</b>  Write a review of a film or TV show that you have watched this week. What happened? What was your favourite part?	<b>Science:</b>  Go on a rock hunt and group the rocks you find into different categories. Investigate how many different categories you could use to group the rocks.	<b>PE:</b>  Take part in the daily mile with someone else in your house – this could just be around your garden.	
<b>Maths:</b>  Choose a maths game to play each day. Make sure you choose different games from the ones you played last week! Have ago at using paragraphs.  Can you show off your best handwriting?	<b>PSHE:</b>  Create a positive thoughts diary.  Record a positive thought at the end of each day. Think back and reflect on the day, only positive thoughts are allowed in this diary!	<b>History:</b>  Our new topic this term is all about dinosaurs. Can you complete some research about a dinosaur of your choice?	
<b>Reading</b> – Children should be encouraged to read every day. Please spend 5 or 10 minutes listening to your child read and discussing their books. Mrs Appleyard and Miss Plaskitt would love to know about what books you have been reading!		<b>Maths</b> – All children from Year 1 to Year 6 have all been provided with a log in for Times Table Rockstars or Numbots. Children should be completing at least 3x5 minutes each week.
