Maths: Choose a maths game to play each day. Have a go making up new rules or inventing your own maths game. https://matr.org/blog/fun-maths-games-activities-for-kids/	English: Practise your year 3/4 spellings from the provided list. Remember to use as many different strategies as you can (rainbow writing, speed writing, pyramid writing, spider web)	Science: Have a look around your home and find as many sources of light as you can. Investigate how shadows are formed, thinking about opaque, transparent and translucent materials.	Art: Use the free app, Doodle Buddy, to create your own digital art based on planet Earth. Try to use different techniques from artists we have used in class.

English: Write a short diary entry each day to explain what you've been up to. Remember to use first person, time conjunctions and paragraphs. You can use the internet to help you. You could also try and teach a family member or friend some French that you have learned this term.	
Maths: Make your own clock from card or paper and try telling the time to the nearest 5-minute interval, including o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to.	English: Read a new book and complete a book review.	RE: This term we have been learning about thankfulness. Create a powerpoint about things you are thankful. Try to use some of the features you have learned about in ICT this term.	D&T / Cooking: Create/build a model raft or boat for Jemmy Button to return home to his island.
