Practice column addition with your tens and ones, then have a go at drawing them out. Once you have done this, practise column addition with just numbers.</p>	<p>English – Jemmy Button</p> <p>Write a diary from the perspective of somebody who has just moved to a foreign country. Think about how you would feel if you were in a strange place without your friends and family.</p>	<p>Science</p> <p>Think about how shadows are created. Can you create a shadow picture with your hands?</p>	<p>Art</p> <p>Create a self portrait in the style of Georges Seurat (pixel pointillism)</p>
