Please remember this term...

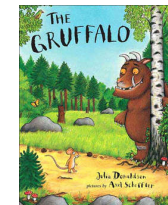
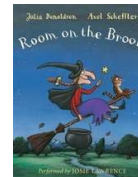
We will investigate the changes from Autumn into Winter.

As Coningsby Authors we will be focusing our work around four stories - Stickman, The Gruffalo, Room on the Broom and Superworm. We will be doing lots of brilliant writing using these stories as a starting point.

As Coningsby Mathematicians we will be learning to add and subtract using objects, pictures and explaining our thinking. We will compare numbers and find more and less.

We will also be exploring 2D and 3D shapes.

Our topic lessons this term have a History focus. We will be looking at toys. We will explore what toys we play with, what our Parents played with and our Grandparents. We will make timelines and our own Toy museum.

As Coningsby Believers we will be exploring what Christians believe about the story of Creation. We will explore God the creator, why Christians are thankful to God, what we would ask God the creator and how we can show we are grateful for what we are given.

In Art and DT this term, we will be printing with natural and man made objects to create pictures linked to the stories by Julia Donaldson.
