What do they eat and what special features does it have? Is it a herbivore, carnivore or omnivore? What does it like to eat? What special things can it do? Refer back to the book and the different things the dragons did. Encourage children to think of ways to finish the sentences and add interesting vocabulary to the writing. After each sentences check it back to make sure it makes sense and ask the children to help them read the sentence.
<b>Art</b>  Imagine you are a knight in medieval times. Can you design your armour? As a grown up to help you find some pictures and ideas!	<b>History</b> What is a knight? Research medieval knights and find out what they did. Look at coats of arms and design one for your family.	<b>PSHE</b> Discuss these questions before watching the story. What exactly is kindness? What is it to be kind? Is it being helpful? Being polite?
