Compare the pictures and work out which parts of your face are different to show different moods.</p> <p>Go back to them a few days later and see if you can remember which drawing was for which mood.</p>	<p>Matchbox Treasure's Challenge</p> <p>You will need an empty raisin box or matchbox. (you can print one from here http://allfreeprintable.com/matchbox-template)</p> <p>Your challenge is to take it outside into the garden, or with you on your daily walk and fill it with as many natural treasures as you can find. You may spot a beautiful petal, a colourful tiny pebble or an interesting piece of twig. No insects allowed! You could challenge your grown up or a member of your family to do it too. When your box is full you need to count them. How many will you fit in the tiny box? Which one will be your favourite treasure? Who will manage to fit in the most?
